The Feast of Good Wine

Thomas Robinson, Luke: Anointed with God's Spirit 14, October 17, 2021

Luke 5:27-39 Trans. TR

²⁷ Sometime later, Jesus went out and watched a tax collector named Levi, sitting at the customs station. Then he said to him, "Follow me." ²⁸ And leaving everything there, the man rose and started following Jesus.

²⁹ Now Levi made a big reception in his house for Jesus, and a large crowd was present made up of tax collectors and others, who were all reclining with them for the banquet.

³⁰ Then the Pharisees and their legal scholars started grumbling to Jesus' disciples, saying, "Why are all of you eating and drinking with tax collectors and sinners?"

³¹ And in response, Jesus said to them, "Those who are in good health don't have any need of a doctor, but rather those who are suffering. ³² I haven't come to call righteous people but sinful people into a change of heart."

³³ But they said to him, "Well, the disciples of John practice frequent fasting and making prayers of entreaty, and so also those of the Pharisees, but your followers are eating and drinking."

³⁴ But Jesus said to them, "Are you really able to make the members of a wedding party practice a fast while the bridegroom is right there with them?

³⁵ Days will come! Then, whenever the bridegroom's been taken from them, they're going to fast in those days."

³⁶ Jesus also used to tell them a parable: "Nobody, when they've torn a decorative applique from a new-made piece of clothing, then sews it onto an ancient garment. If they do, they're going to tear up the new-made, and that decorative piece from the new won't match with the older garment.

³⁷ And nobody puts just-pressed wine into aged wineskins. If they do, the still-fermenting wine is going to break open the wineskins. Then the wine itself is

going to drain out, and the wineskins will be ruined. ³⁸ No, wine that's still fermenting has to be put in new-made wineskins.

³⁹ And nobody, after drinking well-aged wine, desires what's still fermenting, for he says, 'The aged wine is excellent.'"
