	4. Mar. 22 p. 246 Lent 4	Mary anoints Jesus	John 12:1–19	Mary honored Jesus as she anointed his feet with costly perfume and wiped them with her hair. Later, a great crowd shouted praises to Jesus as he entered Jerusalem.	To see ways people showed love for Jesus
	5. Mar. 29 p. 264 <i>Lent 5</i>	The Last Supper	Matthew 26:1–5, 14–30	Judas and the leaders plotted Jesus' arrest. Jesus shared Passover with his disciples. He said the betrayer was among them.	To experience Jesus' last meal with his friend
	6. Apr. 5 p. 266, 268 <i>Lent 6</i>	Jesus' arrest and death	Matthew 26:36– 27:66	Judas helped the soldiers arrest Jesus. They took him to be questioned. Eventually soldiers led Jesus to be crucified between two criminals, and he died.	To remember that Jesus suffered and died
	7. Apr. 12 p. 270 <i>Easter</i>	Jesus is risen!	Matthew 28:1– 10	Women went to the tomb. A dazzling angel rolled the stone away. They met the risen Jesus, who sent them to Galilee with the news.	To wonder at Jesus' resurrection
CARING FOR THE LEAST	8. Apr. 19 p. 28	God hears Hagar and Ishmael	Genesis 16:1–15; 21:8–21	When Sarai and Abram had no children, Abram fathered Ishmael with his slave Hagar. Later God saved Ishmael and Hagar and promised Ishmael many descendants.	To know that God hears our cries
	9. Apr. 26 p. 40	Moses is born	Exodus 1:1–2:10	The Israelites were fruitful and multiplied despite being oppressed. Shiphrah and Puah saved Hebrew boys. Moses' sister and Pharaoh's daughter helped rescue Moses.	To see the courage of the midwives
	10. May 3 p. 58	Jubilee	Leviticus 25:8–55	God's laws included provision for a fiftieth year of rest and equality. Freedom and land would be restored to those who had incurred debts.	To hear God's desire for freedom and fairness
	11. May 10 p. 200	Don't worry	Matthew 6:25– 34	God cares for the birds and flowers. How much more, then, does God care for us? Strive for God's righteousness, and other things will be taken care of.	To observe how God provides
	12. May 17 p. 220	True greatness	Mark 9:33–37	Jesus' disciples argued about who was the greatest. Jesus told them that anyone who wants to be first must be the servant of all.	To learn how Jesus defined greatness
	13. May 24 p. 258	Caring for those in need	Matthew 25:31– 46	Jesus will return in glory. All will come before him, and he will separate people based on how they have treated those who are sick, hungry, imprisoned, or strangers.	To heed Jesus' call to tend to those in need
