### Psalm 100:1-5

A psalm. For giving grateful praise.

<sup>1</sup>Shout for **iov** to the **LORD**, all the earth.

<sup>2</sup> Worship the LORD with gladness;

come before him with joyful songs.

<sup>3</sup> Know that the LORD is God.

It is he who made us, and we are his;

we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

<sup>4</sup> Enter his gates with **thanksgiving** 

and his courts with praise;

give thanks to him and praise his name.

<sup>5</sup> For the LORD is good

and his **love** endures forever;

his faithfulness continues through all generations.

#### 2 Corinthians 9:10-15

<sup>10</sup> He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness.

<sup>11</sup> You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God. <sup>12</sup> For the ministry of this service is not only supplying the needs of the saints but is also overflowing in many thanksgivings to God.

<sup>13</sup> By their approval of this service, they will **glorify God** because of your submission flowing from your **confession of the gospel of Christ**, and the **generosity** of your contribution for them and for all others, <sup>14</sup> while **they long for you and pray for you**, because of the surpassing **grace of God** upon you.

#### **Ephesians** 5:15-20

<sup>15</sup> Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, <sup>16</sup> making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. <sup>17</sup> Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. <sup>18</sup> And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, <sup>19</sup> addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, <sup>20</sup> giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### 1 Chronicles 16:7-12, 28-29, 31-34

- <sup>7</sup> Then on that day **David first appointed that thanksgiving be sung to the LORD** by Asaph and his brothers.
- <sup>8</sup> Oh give thanks to the LORD; call upon his name; make known his deeds among the peoples!
- <sup>9</sup> Sing to him; sing praises to him; tell of all his wondrous works!
- <sup>10</sup> Glory in his holy name;

let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice!

<sup>11</sup> Seek the LORD and his strength; seek his presence continually!

<sup>12</sup> Remember the **wondrous works** that he has done, his miracles and the judgments he uttered,...

- <sup>28</sup> Ascribe to the LORD, O clans of the peoples, ascribe to the LORD **glory and strength!**
- <sup>29</sup> Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; bring an offering and come before him!

Worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness;...

<sup>31</sup> Let the **heavens be glad**, and let the **earth rejoice**, and let them say among the nations,

"The LORD reigns!"

<sup>32</sup> Let the **sea roar**, and all that fills it; let the **field exult**, and everything in it!

- <sup>33</sup> Then shall the **trees of the forest sing for joy** before the LORD, for he comes to judge the earth.
- <sup>34</sup> Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever!

### Thanksgiving in a Complicated World

<u>Giving Thanks takes us into the heart of life with God</u>. God is <u>creator</u> of this world, but he made it <u>complicated</u> – a world in which we make a difference for better or worse. A world full of good & bad, pleasure & suffering, nobility & wickedness, freedom & oppression.

The "problem of evil" is often raised against belief in God. But non-belief doesn't solve the problem. It leaves the suffering and says that it is meaningless. Only in Jesus do we see God neck-deep under our evil, suffering, death; taking it on himself, creating hope and life.

When you <u>step inside that Gospel</u>, you learn not just to be stoic in suffering, but to <u>rejoice</u> and give thanks in <u>all the circumstances of life</u> – even sitting in prison with Paul.

The true challenge is the "<u>problem of good</u>." How can there be so much beauty, strength, life, creativity, hope, healing, justice, love in a world where so many things can go wrong.

<u>Christian worship is Eucharist</u> (Thanksgiving) – broken body, shed blood, the gift of life – God's sacrifice to give us his eternal life, enfold us in his love, redeem his whole creation. It fills our <u>teaching</u>. We <u>sing</u> thanks; we <u>pray</u> thanks; we <u>give</u> to learn/express gratitude.

## Thanksgiving and Stewardship of God's Creation

- The moment we are born we receive the vast <u>gift</u> of this <u>world and life</u>. It's a great journey, a challenging exploration, a home, a dangerous adventure, a school for human character.

  Christians need to join fully in <u>scientific discovery</u>, <u>artistic expression</u>, <u>creation of culture</u>.
- We work in the world knowing that "The Lord is God...and we are his." We receive the world as <u>a trust</u> given to us, within a larger reality. We are God's <u>stewards of a beautiful</u> <u>creation</u>, to implement God's own creative care for his world, to bless and not destroy.
- We are <u>stewards of our own lives</u> (we return them to God), in all their complexity and <u>individuality</u>. We are stewards of our experiences, sufferings, successes, gifts. We need to take our <u>aifts</u> seriously, not denigrate them. We need to learn through our <u>pains</u>.
- We learn to <u>see everything as a trust not a possession</u>. Nothing is permanently ours except <u>the life we create by God's grace</u>. But that, inadequate as we are, God takes and makes into something truly astonishing coming to new life in a world renewed by God.

## Thanksgiving in the Circles of Family and Community

- Giving thanks, stewardship, generosity, worship are <u>to be shared</u>. They expand in ever-widening circles. We are grateful for healthy families, for all we learn of love and vulnerability. We seek healing for broken relationships. Invest time and energy in loving relationships.
- We're part of a community of thanks with others on the same journey. But also back and forward through time. We "give thanks to the Lord for He is good. His love endures forever."
