Casting Peace Upon the Earth

Luke 2:1-14

¹ In those days a decree went out from **Caesar Augustus** that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ And all went to be registered, each to his own town.

⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵ to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child.

⁶ And while they were there, the **time came for her to give birth**. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in **a manger** (feed trough), because there was no place for them in the inn.

Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" ... ⁴¹ And when he drew near and saw the city, he wept over it, ⁴² saying, "Would that you had known on this day, even you, the things that make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes."

³³ "I have said these things to you, that <u>in me you may have peace</u>. In the world you will have <u>tribulation</u>. But take heart; <u>I have overcome the world</u>."

From Augustus to a Feed Trough

- The Gospel always seeks to open our eyes, renew our minds, to help us see the truth that the world at its deepest, most important level is far different from what we're often told. Advent is the story of a "coming," an invasion of a baby, a heavenly army, a new/old story, a new paradigm of reality. It's a story that's exhilarating, depressing, tender, horrific, full of symbolic elements and gritty reality. It challenges us to look and listen.
- We start with the song of the invading angel army: "Peace on Earth..." "Great joy for all people." We set those words beside Jesus' surprising warning: "Don't think that I came to cast peace on the earth...." Both are given to us. What's going on? What can we see?
- Luke's narrative from the very beginning challenges us readers to see the paradox of events. Place yourself back in the Roman world of the 1st cent. when Luke first was read. You didn't grow up with Christmas carols but with public celebrations of the emperor. "Caesar Augustus" was past like Lincoln, if Lincoln had served 12 4-year terms, and died in office. He was the great peace-maker, benefactor, savior, god, origin of "Good News."
- Here <u>he defines one of two contrasting stories</u>: The Roman controllers, taxers, governors, who can send everyone scurrying. Power, money, violence. All the stuff we love to celebrate in our movies. All the stuff that's real, that really matters. Or is it unreal and passing?
- Then <u>the other story</u>: Joseph and Mary, betrothed, 9 months pregnant, scurrying to pay tax in a village on the edge of empire, Bethlehem. The baby comes, the anticipated son (Lk 1). She wraps him tight and lays him in a feed trough, the best available cradle.
- God breaks in with his <u>Good News</u>, not to Caesar but to shepherds. The world's <u>Savior</u> is born, the <u>anointed king</u>, the <u>Lord</u>. His sign is the feed trough where he lies as a baby. A vast angelic army breaks in, singing God's glory and Peace for people because God favors them.

What is Peace?

- Peace is a challenge. It's the <u>end of conflict</u>/war. That's hard, perhaps impossible. It's people getting along, respecting each other, treating each other fairly, honorably. It's <u>Shalom</u>, wholeness, when people are true to God, caring for their neighbor, creating justice. It's a fruit of the Spirit, a deep God-given reality, peace that passes understanding, guarding us.
- But "Peace" is also a human word that's slippery and deceptive. We want peace in our family our way, peace with in-laws, peace in our group allied with Roman power, or peace in our group our own "we" fighting fiercely against the Romans. We are defined against them. We have our stories in which we are peace-makers. Someone else is the cause of trouble.
- Jesus warns his disciples that he's casting a sword, slicing through that world. Cutting through natural structures (Micah), calling to a new love! "Whoever doesn't take up... the sword(?) ... his cross"! That baby in the feed trough was the sword. He disturbs, messes up the order and identity of our lives. If you've already got it, you'll lose it. But if you've lost your life, your identity, your us vs. them, your base of security and power for his sake, you will find it!
- We live in a world of trouble. It matters whether you live in the story of Augustus or of the baby in the feed trough. Every good structure, good relationship is also corruptible. Again and again we are called to self-giving love, to take up not the sword but the cross, to create the way of peace, with equity, honor, love. We are called to live the story of Jesus.

²¹ And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb. ²² And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") ²⁴ and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the Law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons."

²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. ²⁶ And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. ²⁷ And he came in the Spirit into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, ²⁸ he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said,

²⁹ "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word;

³⁰ for my eyes have seen your salvation

³¹ that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel."

ESV Isaiah 9:6

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

⁷⁶ And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways, ⁷⁷ to give knowledge of salvation to his people in the forgiveness of their sins, ⁷⁸ because of the tender mercy of our God, whereby the sunrise shall visit us from on high ⁷⁹ to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."
