# Jesus and the Wind of the Spirit

### John 3:1-16

<sup>1</sup> Now there was a man of the Pharisees named **Nicodemus**, a ruler of the Jews. <sup>2</sup> He came to **Jesus** by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you have **come from God as a teacher**, for no one is able do these **signs** that you are doing unless **God is with him**."

<sup>3</sup> Jesus responded, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is **born from above** (again) they cannot **see the kingdom of God**."

<sup>4</sup> Nicodemus asked, "How can a person be **born** when they're **old**? Can they enter a second time into their mother's womb and be born?"

<sup>5</sup> Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is **born from water and Spirit** (*pneuma*), he cannot **enter the kingdom of God**. <sup>6</sup> That which is born from the **flesh** is flesh, and that which is born from the **Spirit** is **spirit** (*pneuma*). <sup>7</sup> Do not marvel that I said to you, '**All of you must be born from above**.' <sup>8</sup> The **Spirit/wind** (*pneuma*) **blows where it wishes**, and you **hear** its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is **born of the Spirit/wind**."

<sup>9</sup> Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things happen?"

<sup>10</sup> Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not know these things? <sup>11</sup> Truly, truly, I say to you, we're speaking what **we know**, and bearing witness to **what we've seen**, but you do not receive our testimony. <sup>12</sup> If I have told you **earthly things** and you don't believe, how will you believe if I tell you **heavenly things**?

<sup>13</sup> No one has **ascended into heaven** except he who descended from heaven, **the Son of Man**. <sup>14</sup> And as Moses lifted up the **serpent in the wilderness**, so must **the Son of Man** be **lifted up**, <sup>15</sup> that **whoever believes in him may have eternal life**.

<sup>16</sup> For **God so loved the wor**ld, that he gave his **only Son**, that whoever **believes in him** should **not perish** but have **eternal life**."

#### John 1:11-13

<sup>11</sup> He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. <sup>12</sup> But to all who received him, he gave <u>authority to become children of God</u>, to those who <u>believe</u> on his name, <sup>13</sup> who were <u>born</u>, not from blood, nor from the flesh's will, nor from a man's will, but <u>from God</u>.

#### John 1:51

<sup>51</sup> Jesus said to Nathaniel, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending on <u>the Son of Man</u>."

#### John 6:61-63

<sup>61</sup> [Jesus said,] "Do you take offense at this? <sup>62</sup> Then what if you were to see <u>the Son of Man</u> ascending to where he was before? <sup>63</sup> <u>It is the Spirit who gives life</u>; the flesh is no help at all. <u>The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life</u>."

#### John 7:37-39

<sup>37</sup> Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him <u>come to me and drink</u>. <sup>38</sup> Whoever <u>believes</u> in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow <u>rivers of living wa</u>ter." <sup>39</sup> Now this he said about <u>the Spirit</u>, whom those who believed in him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

#### John 12:32

<sup>32</sup> [Jesus said,] "And I, when Lam lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself."

#### Genesis 1:2

<sup>2</sup> The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And <u>the</u> <u>Spirit/wind of God was hovering over the face of the waters</u>.

#### Numbers 21:8

<sup>8</sup> And the LORD (*Yahweh*) said to Moses, "Make <u>a fiery serpent and set it as a sign</u>, and if a serpent bites anyone, everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, <u>shall liv</u>e."

#### Daniel 7:13-14

<sup>13</sup> "I saw ... visions: with the clouds of heaven there came one like <u>a son of man</u>, and he came to the <u>Ancient of Days</u> and was presented before him. <sup>14</sup> And to him was given authority and glory and a kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should revere him; ... an everlasting authority....

#### Romans 5:5-6

<sup>5</sup> Hope does not put us to shame, because <u>the love of God</u> has been <u>poured into our hearts through</u> <u>the Holy Spirit</u> who has been given to us. <sup>6</sup> For while we were still <u>weak</u>, at the right time <u>Messiah</u> died for <u>us ungodly</u>.

## The Searcher Struggling to Understand

- John gives us a glimpse of a likely long, but amazing conversation. Jesus has just confronted the temple authorities and now one of them, impressed, comes to Jesus: a <u>Pharisee</u>, a teacher, member of Sanhedrin, open to Jesus' teaching, affirming God's presence.
- <u>Jesus takes him seriously</u>. He has seen signs, but they point to revealing a <u>new reality in Jesus</u>. He unveils the new level of God engaging humans, doing what the temple had symbolized. Birth "from above" (*anothen*) can also mean "again." It's misunderstood by <u>Nicodemus</u>.

## Birth from Above and the Breath of God

- Jesus is intentionally <u>mysterious/poetic</u> to help N. to think in new ways. The very idea of <u>birth</u> means starting over, profound change of things as they are, new <u>learning</u>, new <u>growth</u>.
- But also <u>a new basis of life from God</u>. As the <u>Spirit</u> / <u>God's breath</u> was in the first creation, so "born from water and Spirit" is new creation. For even a well-respected teacher? Yes! N. is a good man, but he needs the very life/presence of God, the Spirit, sensed in Jesus.
- Temple, Law, Sanhedrin the heart of control, God within bounds. Jesus speaks of <u>Wind</u>, the <u>uncontrollable power of God's Spirit</u>; birth from the blowing Wind/Breath of creation. The character of the Spirit changes the character of the child born from above. Jesus was in a process of giving that Spirit, by his teaching, his action, his promise, his own presence.

## **God's Transforming Passion and Gift**

- Jesus meet N.'s lack of understanding with further challenge: There's so much more. This is like the sign of the dangerous <u>serpent</u> that could heal as in Moses' days (Num 21). It's the "<u>Son of Man</u>" who unites heaven and earth, brings God's kingdom to earth, as in Daniel.
- The Son of Man will be <u>lifted up/exalted</u> on a <u>cross</u>. His power/authority begins from that cross, because it embodies the <u>passion of a loving God</u>. God deeply loves the people of his creation in spite of their brokenness and rebellion and inability to help/heal themselves. We love the idea of self-sufficiency, independence. We can improve ourselves marginally, but we can't stop our perishing. <u>God wants to give more</u>. He gives himself in Jesus, the Son.
- He calls us to believe, to trust his love, trust his gift, <u>receive God's life in his surprising Spirit</u>, to receive new life that in no way negates our physical life, but lifts it to new <u>union with God's</u> <u>life</u>. This love, gift, new life breaks through the barrier of perishing into <u>eternal life now</u>.
