God's Self-giving Glory – Life for Us

Philippians 2:1-11 (Translation TR)

2^{:1}Therefore, if there is any encouragement in our Anointed King (*Christos*), if any support that flows from love (*agapé*), if any sharing of Spirit, if any deep feelings and expressions of empathy, ² fill up my joy, which is that you think (*phronein*) with a single focus, having the same love, together in soul and thinking the one thing – ³ not drawing your thinking from <u>individual</u> <u>ambition</u> or <u>empty glory</u>, but with humility of thought considering each other more important than yourselves, ⁴ with each one watching out not for personal interests, but each of the group for the interests of others.

⁵ Think this in yourselves as a community, which also means in Messiah Jesus, ⁶ who,

Though he was indeed in God's form, He didn't consider that equality with God as something to be exploited.

> ⁷ Rather he **emptied himself**, by taking **a slave's form**, by coming to be in the **likeness of humans**.

> > ⁸ And when he was found in shape as a human, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross!

⁹Therefore, God has both highly exalted him and graced him with the name that is above every name,

¹⁰ so that in **Jesus' name every knee will bow**, of those in **heaven**, on **earth** and **under earth**,

¹¹ and every tongue confess that "Jesus Messiah is LORD," revealing God the Father's Glory.

Exodus 40:34-5 God's Glory in the Tabernacle/Tent (Cf. 1Kings 8:11, in Solomon's Temple) ³⁴ Then the <u>cloud</u> covered the <u>tent of meeting</u>, and <u>the glory of Yahweh/Lord</u> filled the tent. ³⁵ And Moses was not able to enter the <u>tent of meeting</u> because ... <u>the glory of Yahweh/Lord</u> <u>filled the tent</u>.

John 1:14 God's Glory in the Word tenting among us

¹⁴ And the <u>Word became flesh</u> and <u>tented</u> among us, and we have seen his <u>glory</u>, glory as of one unique from a Father, full of grace and truth.

Isaiah 42:8 Name and Glory Cf. Exod 6:2-3

⁸I am Yahweh/Lord. This is my <u>name</u>. I will not give my <u>glory</u> to any another.

Isaiah 45:22-23 Yahweh solemnly calls:

²² "Turn to me and be saved, <u>all the ends of the earth!</u> For I am God, and there is no other. ²³ By myself I have sworn; ... a word that shall not return: To me every knee shall bow, every tongue shall confess allegiance."

Habakkuk 2:14 Habakkuk echoes Isaiah's prophecy of the Messiah (11:9) and other passages. For the earth will be filled with the knowledge-of-the-glory-of-Yahweh/Lord as the waters cover the sea.

Acts 2:36 Peter on the day of Pentecost

 36 "Let all the house of Israel therefore know unshakably that God has made him both <u>LORD and Messiah</u> (Anointed King), this Jesus whom you crucified."

1 Corinthians 8:6

⁶ But for us there is <u>one God the Father</u> from whom are all things and we into him, and <u>one LORD</u>, <u>Jesus Messiah</u>, through whom are all things and we through him.

Who is God? The Quest to Know God's Glory

What does "God" mean? "We seek to worship and glorify God." Sovereign, omnipotent, omniscient, eternal, glorious beyond imagination. Does that carry over to his people? Paul is in a center of emperor worship: God is real power, Augustus, Rome, empire.

Or is God exalted far from human life, distant watchmaker, maybe breaks in with miracles.

Paul's been dealing with his own chains and the Philippians' suffering. Do they belong to a glorious God? The true God? Then why chains? Why not empire? Where's God's glory when you're in prison, your family in danger. Paul models, challenges, guides.

He describes a way of life focused on a way of thinking – community in Messiah Jesus. He leads them into a hymn about Jesus centered on the remarkable journey from "God's form" and "equality with God" to "death on a cross." But the hymn is not just about Jesus. It is about God and God's glory. Jesus' resurrection and exaltation by God is God's most emphatic and defining statement about God's identity. Jesus is graced with God's own name "LORD" (*Kurios*) the translation of *Yahweh*. God calls for scripture to be read in a new way – to understand we must see where God is going.

Jesus – The Story of Israel, Humanity, and God

Much of scripture is about revealing God's glory, name, identity. God creates all that exists plus humans in God's image, bearing something of his glory. The Exodus unfolds the revelation of God's glory: his name, deliverance from slavery, manna, Sinai, Tent of meeting. But always with an edge of Israel's brokenness. Is this only Israel's national god? No. God created and claims all that exists, all beings.

Jesus comes as a human like Adam & Eve. He takes a slave's form like Israel in Egypt. He embodies the whole human story: true humanity's rule & broken humanity' suffering and death. But he also comes as one truly "equal to God" revealing true divinity. Being true God is self-giving love that takes on the experience and hope of God's creatures. He shows God's love and intention for his human creation and what he will do in love.

God's Amazing Glory and Our Life

Jesus, God says, is Me, Yahweh, LORD, my Glory! Now truly enfolding you, broken human! This is what the whole story is about! Take that in! Focus your mind & understanding.

Out of it flows a whole, beautiful, glorious life (even in prison). Encouragement, Love, God's Spirit, true empathy and mercy, self-giving for others in a whole community.
