Good News in the Heart of Worship

Thomas Robinson, How the Gospel Works 3, September 29, 2019

Hebrews 12:18-29 Translation TR

¹⁸ You haven't come to something that can be touched: blazing fire, darkness, a realm of gloom, a whirlwind, ¹⁹ a trumpet's blare, or a voice speaking in a way that made the hearers beg that not another word be added. [Ex. 20:18-19] ²⁰ For they couldn't endure the command that "*If even a wild animal touches the mountain, it must be stoned to death.*" [Ex. 19:12-13] ²¹ Indeed, what appeared was so terrifying that even Moses said, "*I tremble with fear.*" [Deut. 9:19].

²² But **you have come**

to Zion, mountain and city of a living God, heavenly Jerusalem,

to myriads of angels in festal gathering,

²³ to an assembly of **firstborn people**, enrolled in heaven,

to God, judge of all beings,

to spirits of righteous people brought to mature perfection,

²⁴ to **Jesus** as mediator of a **new covenant**,

to **blood** for sprinkling that says something better than Abel's.

²⁵ Make sure you don't beg not to hear the one speaking; for if they couldn't escape when they refused the one who warned on earth, how much less we, if we refuse the one from heaven!

²⁶ Back then, his voice shook the earth, but now he's made a promise in these words,

"Yet once for all, I myself will **shake not only the earth but also the heaven**." [Haggai 2:6] ²⁷ That phrase, "Yet once for all," indicates the removal of all that's shaken – things that have been made – in order that what's not shaken may remain. ²⁸ Since we're receiving a **kingdom that can never be shaken**, let's hold on to **thanksgiving**, through which **we offer worship** pleasing to God with **reverence** and **awe**. ²⁹ For indeed our "God is a consuming fire" [Deut 4:24].

Colossians 3:12-17 Translation TR

¹² Since God has **chosen** all of you, **set you apart**, and **loved you**, then **dress** the part wearing hearts full of **tenderness**, wearing **kindness**, **humility**, **gentleness**, and **patience**. ¹³ Bear with each other and **give grace** to each other, if one has a complaint against another. Just as **the Lord gave grace to you**, so must you.

¹⁴ And over all these, **clothe yourselves with love**, which ties everything together for real maturity. ¹⁵ And let **the Messiah's peace** set the standard in the way your hearts think, since you were called into that peace in his one body. And be **thankful**!

¹⁶ Let the **message of the Messiah** dwell in all of you **richly**, as you **instruct** and **counsel** each other with real wisdom, by his grace singing **Spirit-empowered Psalms**, **Hymns**, and **Songs**, singing with your **whole being** to **God**. ¹⁷ And whatever you do, by word or action, do everything as **one who belongs to Lord Jesus**, giving thanks through him to **God the Father**.

Hebrews 10:23-25

²³Let's hold firmly to our <u>affirmation of hope</u> without turning aside, for the one who made the <u>promise</u> is <u>faithful</u>. ²⁴ And let's <u>think deeply about each other</u> with the aim of stirring up <u>love</u> and <u>excellent works</u>, ²⁵ not neglecting our <u>assembling with each other</u>, as is a habit for some, but <u>encouraging</u> one another, and all the more as you see the Day ever closer.

Luke 24:30-32 (Jesus with two disciple in Emmaus after his resurrection)

²⁴ When Jesus was at table with them, he took <u>the bread</u> and blessed and broke it and gave it to them. ³¹ But their <u>eyes were opened</u>, and they recognized him, and he vanished from their sight. ³² They said to each other, "Didn't <u>our heart burn within us</u> as he was talking to us on the road, while he was <u>opening to us the Scriptures</u>?"

Acts 2:41-42

⁴¹Those who welcomed Peter's message were <u>baptized</u>, and about three thousand lives (*psyché*) were added that day. ⁴² They actively devoted themselves to the <u>teaching of the apostles</u> and to the <u>shared life</u> (*koinonia*), to the <u>breaking of the bread</u> and to the <u>prayers</u>.

Proclaiming the Gospel and Doing Worship

- What's the relation between Gospel & worship? A "gospel sermon" moves people to decision: invitation song, coming forward. Worship is the music, various roles, meditative, stirring.
- But <u>the "Gospel" isn't a simple plan of salvation</u>: sin, atonement, decision. It's the <u>Great</u> <u>Announcement that an Event has happened that changes everything</u>. <u>God has come</u> <u>among us</u> showing himself in the human <u>life of Jesus</u>, fulfilling all his purposes and promises since <u>creation</u> and through the life of <u>Israel</u>. In love, He's taken <u>our sin</u> and <u>alienation</u> on himself in <u>Jesus' crucifixion</u>, He's defeated the power of <u>death</u> and created <u>resurrection life</u> in Jesus. He's opened Israel's story and His grace to <u>all the world</u>, giving us humans <u>his own Spirit</u> as our first experience of his <u>immortal</u>, <u>creative life</u>.
- Worship is the <u>celebration of what God has done</u> and is doing. It's plunging ourselves into that reality in music, prayer, communion, opening the scriptures, fellowship, etc.

Worship and Seeing Reality

- <u>Worship is enacted Gospel</u>. A challenge because, like NT times, we live in a world that treats God as our pet philosophy, self-help, private opinion. Real power is in politics, science, entertainment, money. Worship was and is crucial to <u>refocus life on a reality larger than</u> <u>our human structures</u>. We're invited into a total makeover of life as we become disciples.
- <u>Hebrews</u>: persecuted, discouraged believers. They're called to see beyond their limited community, across nations, time, heaven & earth. Mt Sinai was awesome and fearsome. <u>The Gospel reaches beyond</u>, in a community of heaven and earth, Jesus' blood gives grace.
- Every time they/we worship we are in that vast assembly, on <u>Zion</u>, with <u>angels</u>, part of the <u>assembly of God's firstborn</u>, receiving the power of what Jesus has done. Don't miss it!

The Practice of Life in Worship

- The whole of worship proclaims the Gospel: the announcement of what God has done. In Luke & Acts, look at <u>Emmaus</u> and <u>Pentecost</u>: breaking bread and opening Word lead to new vision, way of life, community, sharing life, prayer (Retreat).
- <u>Colossians</u> is like Hebrews but different images. Realize what God has done and "dress" accordingly. All reflect <u>what God shows us in Jesus</u>. We even give grace. Let peace rule.
- <u>Worship works to let the Gospel "dwell" in us "richly"</u>! The whole story, reality shapes life. The Spirit especially uses our <u>songs</u> – <u>poetry made powerful by music</u> – to work into our whole being. Use psalms, sing new songs, chant traditional hymns. God uses them for us.
- The whole worship of the church becomes a proclamation bringing God's Good News into life.
